Jim Wallis is president and founder of Sojourners, a New York Times bestselling author, public theologian, speaker, and international commentator on ethics and public life. He currently serves as the chair of the Global Agenda Council on Values of the World Economic Forum. He is also editor-in-chief of Sojourners magazine, which has a combined print and electronic media readership of more than a quarter million.

He frequently speaks around the United States and abroad. His columns appear regularly in the Huffington Post and Time.

Jim is the author of 10 books, including the New York Times bestseller, God's Politics. His latest book, The (Un)Common Good: How the Gospel Brings Hope to a World Divided (Brazos Press), was released in paperback in June 2014.

Jim Wallis lives in Washington, D.C., with his wife Joy Carroll, one of the first women ordained in the Church of England and author of Beneath the Cassock: The Real-Life Vicar of Dibley, They have two sons, Luke and Jack.
